Come and join us at our biggest sale yet!

The Sardis Secondary plant sale is back for another very exciting year. This year's sale will be the biggest one yet, with all your favourite varieties of flowers as well as an assortment of herbs and vegetables.

This year, our Agriculture students have tripled our hanging basket capacity, working hard to install new irrigation. The students have designed and planted over 200 beautiful planters and even constructed beautiful cedar planters for your

enjoyment. As usual, we have our normal assortment of basket stuffers and bedding plants, including a huge assortment of wave petunias, zonal geraniums, bacopa, verbena, calibrachoa, heliotrope, impatiens, and begonias. New this year is a greater assortment of herbs, along with some popular flower varieties including Martha Washingtons, ivy geraniums, New Guinea impatiens, ranunculus, dracaena, osteospermum and an assortment of perennials.

This year has seen some big changes to our pro-

gram in terms of student involvement. Our second year Agriculture students have been working alongside a UFV professor and have been given full responsibility for the day-to-day upkeep of the greenhouse. They have also been taking a first year university course for dual credit. This has opened the door for them to begin their university career while still in high school.

We are very excited about the program and cannot wait to share the experience on Saturday, May 8th from 7:00am to 3:00pm.
