



Chilliwack Artists In Our Midst Scholarship Application Form

All graduating Grade 12 students that will be continuing studies in an approved Visual Arts Program are eligible for this scholarship.

Applicants must agree to the following:

1) **Submit a portfolio containing the following:**

- a) Name, address, phone number and school that you currently attend
- b) at least one piece of original art work (whatever medium, and provided that the medium and size allows transporting), completed by you in the past year
- c) a minimum of 6 and maximum of 12 images of original art work completed by you in the past year; photographs at least 4" x 6" in size, or digital images at least 4" x 6" in size with a resolution of 300 or more
- d) 2 references with at least one of these from an art teacher
- e) resume
- f) name of Approved Visual Arts Program(s) you are considering
- g) where you feel you began your artistic endeavours
- h) where you feel you are now in your artistic endeavours
- i) where do you see yourself going in the future?
- j) why you feel you deserve this scholarship

- 4) the successful candidate must agree to having his/her name submitted along with photographs of their art work for possible publication in local newspapers

The successful candidate will be announced during commencement activities in June. The scholarship will be presented after the candidate has shown proof of admission to an approved Visual Art Program. The scholarship must be claimed within one year of being awarded. He/she will also be asked to take part in a future Chilliwack Artists In Our Midst Exhibition and Sale. The Artists In Our Midst Scholarship Committee reserve the right to hold over the scholarship until the following year if a suitable candidate is not found in any given year.
